More about the theme...

Margaret: Advent is Mary's time, when we can learn by her example to be people who wait in patience for the revelation of God-with-us in this moment. It is a time to ponder the Word and learn again to hold it in our hearts, a time pregnant with expectation and longing. Margaret hopes to explore these notions by penetrating deeply into the infancy narrative of Matthew and Luke. With the help of visual images she hopes to lead the participants into silence and stillness so that we can renew our desire to become people of prayer who are on a mission to share the Word with others.

Malcolm: Advent is a season for stillness, for quiet, for discernment. It is a season of active waiting, listening attentively and being finely tuned to hear again one's deepest yearnings for the saviour. In this retreat Malcolm will look at how poetry can help us fathom the depths of Advent's many paradoxes, looking at poems from the spiritual classics to contemporary voices, and using his own poetry including the great Advent Antiphons.

Cliff College was, historically, a Methodist Lay Training College, which now provides theological education and training with a particular focus on mission and evangelism. Set in the Derbyshire Peak District, the college has extensive grounds amidst excellent walking country and fine views. <u>www.cliffcollege.ac.uk</u>
