years of creating Transformative space to connect with God, self, others, and creation for the Sake of the WOTLd.

two-year Academy for spiritual Formation:

Offers a place for spiritually hungry pilgrims, both clergy and lay, to spend forty days in residence (five days every three months) deepening their lives in Christ, engaging in spiritual practices of body, mind, and spirit in a supportive community, and focusing on outward aspects of faithful leadership in the world.

Five-Day/short-term academy for spiritual

Formation: A "taste" of the Two-Year Academy, the Five-Day Academy, Three-Day Academy, and other short-term offerings of the Academy rhythm are stand-alone retreats that invite participants (both clergy and lay) to spend up to a week in a Christian retreat setting with worship at its center. Each short-term Academy experience includes one or two faculty who present on a theme for the retreat and invites participants to respond to this theme through silence, written and spoken word, prayer, worship, and community sharing.

onLine Academy ModeLs: Multiple online adaptations of the Academy model provide opportunities for clergy and lay to experience the Academy rhythm of prayer and worship, silence and study, community and embodied practice from any location and without traveling to a retreat center. These online models make The Academy more accessible and more affordable to a broader audience, including those who cannot attend an in-person retreat. There are stand-alone retreats such as the online Academy Day Apart as well as multi-session, cohort-based models such as the online one-year journey called *Spiritual Formation in Today's World*.

Academy Pilgrimages: Contemplative pilgrimages to places of spiritual significance offer participants the opportunity to engage spiritual practices based in the Academy model, learn from Academy faculty, and fellowship with other pilgrims on the journey.

International Growth: Since 2003, The Academy has expanded to seven countries outside the U.S. and continues to receive international inquiries regularly, demonstrating its global, multicultural, multiethnic emphasis for the future.

what's Next? The Academy continues to explore new iterations of its model and is focused on increasing its accessibility and sustainability in the years to come. The Academy seeks to be a movement that helps reshape the way people of faith conceive of and live out the Christian life-a way that is rooted in and flows from God's spirit and action in the world. Academy pilgrims are the leaven in the loaf of contemporary Christianity, helping lead the way into the next incarnation of the body of Christ. The Academy seeks to model and inspire the formation of Christian communities that embrace the multicultural, multiethnic, interfaith landscape of the 21st century for the transformation of the world.
