The Himalayan word for "place of rest and vision" is "Sumatanga." Surrounded by woods, mountains, lakes and streams, away from the interruptions of everyday life. Camp Sumatanga is an ideal retreat location for hiking and exploration. Visitors to Sumatanga can rest from their burdens, and listen to God in the silence of 1700 acres of natural beauty. Seventy-Five years ago, the North Alabama Conference of the United Methodist Church began building this camp which has hosted tens of thousands of pilgrims. The camp has a 55-acre lake, outdoor labyrinth, hiking and biking trails, game fields, playground, fire pits, as well as volleyball and basketball courts. Both 2-year, and 5-Day Academies for Spiritual Formation have been held at Sumatanga since the mid 1980s.

Our theme is "Welcoming the Wilderness." As Dr. Peacock says, "This is a time of invitation, indeed, a welcome into the wilderness probably not planned or imagined but nevertheless we are Here." We will explore the wilderness as metaphor in scripture as well as a literal reality, and explore spiritual practices to guide us along the way. This 4-Day Academy hopes to be an oasis in the desert for those who feel discouraged, spiritually dry, questioning, tired or wherever they are on the journey. The daily themes will be: gifts, fears, stillness, healing, and hope. God tells Hosea that it is in the wilderness where God will speak to our hearts. (Hosea 2:14) The Academy provides an environment where we can listen to God.
